## Where Are the Jobs?

The Texas Legislature, nearing final adjournment for another two years, have passed or will pass an astounding number of bills limiting, invading the lives of Texans. Voter ID's requiring persons younger than 70 to show a picture ID - a procedure already being implemented in Early Voting at the Garland City Hall. Lawsuits are being limited by widening the rules for how and why a loser must pay the lawyers and costs of both sides. An amendment to a fiscal matters bill will allow concealed guns in college dorm rooms and a bill to end so-called, "Sanctuary Cities," even though Governor Perry and others could identify no sanctuary cites in Texas. Add to this list, the turn over to Big Oil the power of eminent domain, the loss of funding for Planned Parenthood, suspension of environmental rules and the butchering of the public schools through cuts in spending and implementing rewritten historical facts with so-called, "Christian Doctrine."

\$2,227,300,000 has been collected from Texans in special fees and taxes for worthwhile and specific programs. Of the total collected, \$636,000,000 (less than a third) of the money has gone to the assigned beneficiary like Utility Bill Assistance for the Elderly and Poor, Trauma and EMS services, State Parks and Clean Air. The other two thirds of the collected funds have be reassigned to make up for the budget shortfall. Reassigned to the budget which proclaims a balanced budget without raising taxes. This is only a few of the switches made by the Legislature under the guise of, "no new taxes." Chewing tobacco taxes, now repealed, was to assist rural doctors to pay back their student loans. Specialty licences plate fees go directly to the general fund. HB 2187 gives tax breaks (as high as 99%) to owners of so called mega-yachts. A tax by any other name (like fee), is a tax.

According to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics (updated 5/6/11) in January of 2011, 1,010,600 Texans were unemployed. In March of 2011, after the Legislature had been in session for 3 months, 995,800, 000 Texans were unemployed. During this same 3 months, 37,477 Texas homeowners were foreclosed upon by their lending institutions. 100,000 teachers are to be fired due to the budget crisis. Class sizes are being increased, regardless of counter information from education groups.

Not one jobs bill has been introduced into the Texas Legislature. Not one.

The end of Medicare/Medicaid, under the guise of an ill-conceived voucher system, is being met with universal disdain. "Cutting spending on Medicare was endorsed by just 21 percent, with 78 percent opposed. Cutting Medicare, the federal program aiding the poor, was opposed by a 30-69 percent margin." "A second poll, the McClatchy/Marist survey, found that even Tea Party supporters, by a margin of 70 percent to 28 percent, oppose making cuts the Medicare and Medicaid." Our Garland Representatives: TX3rdR Sam Johnson (Ways and Means Committee: Social Security) and TX 5thR Jeb Hensarling, (Financial Services) voted for the Ryan Budget, which according to the surveys, they voted against the majority of their constituencies.

### Water Wells Near Fracking Gas Wells Contain Up To 17 Times More Methane Congress Ignores Study by National Academy of Sciences, The University of Texas and Duke University


A new study published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences reports the results of a systematic study of the chemical contamination of water wells located in the vicinity of gas wells created by hydrofracturing (fracking). The data confirms that the concentration of thermogenic methane increase as the distance between the water well and gas well decreases. Thermogenic methane is the signature of methane that has been trapped in the shale rock deep below the surface of the earth. Methane concentrations were detected in 51 of 60 drinkingwater wells (85%) regardless of gas industry operations, but concentrations were substantially higher

closer to natural-gas wells (Fig. 1). Methane concentrations were 17-times higher on average in shallow wells from active drilling and extraction areas than in wells from inactive areas. The methane, coupled with methane -to-higher-chain hydrocarbons are consistent with deeper thermogenic methane sources such as the Marcellus and Utica shales.

The results show evidence for methane contamination of shallow drinking-water systems in at least three areas of the region and suggest important environmental risks accompanying shale-gas exploration worldwide.

Concerns for groundwater resources are based on (i) fluid (water and gas) flow and discharge to shallow aquifers due to the high pressure of the injected fracturing fluids in the gas wells; (ii) the toxicity and radioactivity of produced water from a mixture of fracturing fluids and deep saline formation waters that may



discharge to the environment; (iii) the potential explosion and asphyxiation hazard of natural gas; and (iv) the large number of private wells in rural areas that rely on shallow groundwater for household and agricultural use. There are up to one million wells in Pennsylvania alone that are typically unregulated and untested

Dissolved methane in drinking water is not currently classified as a health hazard for ingestion, it is an asphyxiant in enclosed spaces such as the basement of a home and an explosion and fire hazard.

Long-term, coordinated sampling and monitoring of industry and private homeowners is needed. Compared to other forms of fossil-fuel extraction, hydraulic fracturing is poorly regulated at the federal level. Fracturing wastes are not regulated as a hazardous waste under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, fracturing wells are not covered under the Safe Drinking Water Act, and only recently has the Environmental Protection Agency asked fracturing firms to voluntarily report a list of the constituents in the fracturing fluids based on the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act.

Systematic and independent data on groundwater quality, including dissolved-gas concentrations and isotopic compositions, should be collected before drilling operations begin in a region, as is already done in some states. These data should be made available for public analysis. Such baseline data would improve environmental safety, scientific knowledge, and public confidence. Similarly, long-term monitoring of groundwater and surface methane emissions during and after extraction.

The study reported by PNAS is consistent with other testing performed in Colorado and Pennsylvania. The exact path of the methane from the shale to the aquifer is not known but the thermogenic methane is a common finding in each case. Methane is present in shallow water wells from a variety of sources but thermionic methane is known to come from gasses embedded in shale rock.


As pointed out in the movie *Gasland*, investigators refused to drink the water they claimed was safe. Maybe we should send "drinking water" to our state legislators.

But the story doesn't end there. A total of 68 million Americans paid no income tax because their income was so low they had no tax liability or they had sufficient deductions to negate the income.



NOTE: The Keystone XL Pipeline will cross more than 70 rivers and streams including the Ogallala Aquifer, the Big Cypress Watershed, starting at Lake Cypress Springs to Caddo Lake (approx. 2,800 sq. miles of water). It also crisscrosses the Sulphur River, Big Sandy Creek, Angelina River, Neches River and Pine Island Bayou.

### **Keystone Pipeline – High Pressure Poison**

Fifty years ago the main threat to civilization was a sky darkened with missiles and planes carrying nuclear weapons. Fortunately, this threat has diminished significantly. Little did we imagine the energy industry would have the potential to poison or kill a large population. We have seen the result of poor nuclear plant design coupled with a natural disaster in Japan. Safe disposal of nuclear waste has not been resolved. We have seen the catastrophic effects of faulty equipment and poor decisions in the Gulf of Mexico. We have seen the impact of a crude oil pipeline rupture and a million gallons of crude oil contamination of the Kalamazoo River in Michigan. The CFL light bulbs contain a poisonous chemical, most of which will end up in city dumps. Solar panels contain poisonous materials needing to be disposed of eventually. Oil and gas both contaminate the air and water supply during drilling and as pumping continues throughout the life of the wells . Oil, gas, coal, and gasoline pollute the air and contribute to global warming as they are consumed.

Water power is safe but places water is available and possible duplication of the Hoover dam are limited without disrupting the lives of a large group of people and changing the environment of a large land mass. Wind power is safe but the wind is not consistent enough in most places to be considered a reliable electrical energy source.

Now there is another concern. TransCanada has proposed building a pipeline to carry crude oil, known as tar-sand oil, from Alberta to refineries in Port Arthur and Houston Texas crossing six states and multiple aquifers supplying water for drinking water and irrigation for millions of people. TransCanada already owns and operates a pipeline that reaches as far south as Cushing, Oklahoma with a branch extended to Patoka, Illinois called the Keystone pipeline. The new pipeline is named Keystone XL.

Canada has the world's largest supply of bitumen. It is estimated that 4,400,000 barrels could be extracted every day for 200 years. Canada is already the largest supplier of crude oil to the United States. About 20% of our crude oil comes from Canada. In return Canada is expected to receive \$47 billion dollars this year.

The "crude oil" to be transported is not the same material as the crude oil from drilled oil wells. The Canadian oil is mined from tar sands as bitumen. Bitumen is a sticky tar-like material. The terms bitumen and asphalt are sometimes used interchangeably. Because it is so thick and mixed with sand and other materials it must be treated and heated before it can be pumped into the pipeline. The bitumen is mixed, 50% bitumen and 50% naphtha into a mixture called DilBit, short for diluted bitumen. Naphtha is a term for many variations of a petroleum distillate but is best known to the public as lighter fluid. Two tons of tar sands produce one barrel of oil.

Oil and gas pipelines have been around criss-crossing our country for many years with very few oil pipeline problems. But DilBit from the tar sands presents a unique problem. The DilBit is highly acidic and contains abrasive particulate matter which is not present in pipelines carrying oil from drilled wells. The abrasive materials and acidic chemicals attack and destroy the pipe much faster than oil from drilled wells. TransCanada has applied for permission to use a thinner pipe which would undoubtedly increase the risk of a rupture. The Keystone XL pipeline is expected to carry up to 900,000 barrels per day at pressures up to 1440 pounds per square inch, at temperatures up to 160 degrees Fahrenheit. These factors may explain why the pipeline in Alberta has four times more failures per mile than the entire U.S. pipeline system even though the U.S. system is much older, roughly forty years versus twenty years. Internal corrosion was the cause of 49% of the failures in the Alberta pipeline system. A DilBit pipe rupture is much more likely to explode and burn than a rupture of a pipeline carrying conventional crude oil.

In **Nebraska**, the concern is the pipeline crosses Niobrara River where shale deposits are prone to fracture and sink making underground pipes especially risky.

In **Montana**, the pipeline will cross the Missouri River, Yellowstone, and Lake Fort Peck tributaries.

In **Kansas**, TransCanada was given a 10 year property tax exemption which could have reduced the tax levy by as much as 30%. Citizens are up in arms due to the lost tax revenue. There is no reasonable explanation given since similar tax relief has not been given in other states. Also in Kansas, TransCanada used eminent domain to obtain an easement through a 160 acre wheat and soybean farm.

In **Texas**, David Daniel asked questions when he discovered people on his property driving stakes in the ground. When he asked questions their response was "They (TransCanada) had the power of eminent domain." [editor: TX HB 3105 gives corporations power of eminent over cities. Button TX112R & Carter TX102R voted in favor of HB3105]

The additional refining activity in Port Arthur and Houston will aggravate an already poor situation. The levels of known cancer-causing chemicals in the Houston air has been detected as high as 20 times higher than in any other city.



Every barrel of oil produced requires 4 barrels of fresh water. The water from this process, contaminated with lead, arsenic, and mercury is pumped into large reservoirs. Communities downstream from tar sands mines in Canada report 500 times more bile duct cancer than reported for those who do not live near the mines. The BP Whiting refinery uses a loop hole in the permit to dump mercury, benzene, lead nickel, ammonia, and vanadium into Lake Michigan. The BP Refinery is the primary source of mercury in Lake Michigan. The gross amount of water required for the refining of the DilBit is a serious concern in arid parts of the country including Texas. <a href="http://www.sierraclub.org/dirtyfuels/downloads/2010-09-TarSands factsheet.pdf">http://www.sierraclub.org/dirtyfuels/downloads/2010-09-TarSands factsheet.pdf</a>

The EPA has issued two environmental reports environmentalists consider inadequate because they fail to address the issues mentioned here and do not adequately address other factors. The report made public in April 2011 contains a statement that is highly questionable. "The impacts from even large spills would likely be limited to localized ground water contamination that would not threaten the regional viability of the aquifer system."

May 7, 2011: A new leak, number 10, is reported in the Keystone pipeline due to a failed fitting. 400 barrels of oil sprayed 70 feet in the air before TransCanada could shut down the pumping station in Sargent county North Dakota. In reality, corporations are playing with fire. The potential for a major leak in the pipeline dumping carcinogens into the water supply for millions of people before it is detected is a reality. The risk is not worth the oil. We must go forward with conservation and alternative energy sources at a faster pace—wind, water and two not mentioned above, geothermal and capturing the energy of ocean waves.

  who might have to deal with accidents involving radiation.
