*Editor's Note: The following article is an exploration of our national debt, written by Steven L. Love (SLL) and Charles E. Ford, Jr. (CEF) Steve posted the original article on Facebook and Chuck responded — not as a duel, but as a discussion. Part 2 will be in the December issue.*

## Understanding the National Debt

### National Debt:

Steve: “every foreign government or international corporation, which holds treasury securities, has a vested interest in our paying our bills ... and knows their money is safe because we have *never* failed to pay our national debt.”

Chuck: True, but we never owed \$22 trillion before with a \$331 billion interest payment.

### Other People's Money

SLL: “Using OPM, other people's money, is preferable to using one's own money, since, if we pay the interest on that debt on time, there is an unlimited amount of OPM available to us, whereas our own money might not be all that abundant, and when spent is gone forever.”

CEF: It is just as important if not more so that the Treasury can continue to sell their bonds, notes, and securities. In January 2018 there was a report that China, the holder of \$1.2 trillion in Treasury securities, was considering to stop or slow buying from the U.S. Treasury in response to Trump's tariffs not because of the size of our debt or our interest payments. Should China decide to sell off their treasury holdings expect dramatic cuts to federal obligations such as Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid, and Defense and chaos in the international financial system.

SLL: “Every dollar loaned to Uncle Sam, by a foreign country, is domestic buying power taken out of *their* economy and put in ours!”

CEF: I agree.

### Percent of the National Debt:

SLL: “Coming out of WWII, the debt was 117 percent of GDP and we moved from a war-time to peace-time economy while paying down that debt. It is 12 percent of today's GDP.”

Chuck's response: The debt is currently 107 percent of GDP. There is a huge difference between the post-WWII period and today. That difference is international competition and unions are powerless. While Europe was rebuilding its infrastructure, we were converting the wartime manufacturing facilities to build consumer products, educating the public and ex-GI's, and investing heavily in expanding the economy. Today's economy is stagnant by comparison. Much of our manufacturing has been drained from our land and a large portion of products offered in our stores and over the internet comes by boat.

### Cost of Debt Service:

SLL: “The cost of our debt service is \$06.8 of every dollar. For every dollar of loans to Uncle Sam by our citizens or corporations, is money returned to the buying power of the nation. Which means, that if we loan money to the government, part of our federal taxes go to pay us interest.”

CEF: Agreed, except with the \$06.8. The debt service is approximately 3 percent.

### Exploring the National Debt

SLL: “The 30-year home mortgage works because how much we owe is less important than what it costs to service what we owe...”

CEF: But even with the mortgage you have to consider your income, property taxes, car payments, health insurance, and multiple other obligations. One cannot just say, “I have \$20,000 in the bank to pay the interest. I'll buy it”

SLL: “During WWII, we bought War Bonds because it was the patriotic thing to do. It was also the smart thing to do, because unlike stocks or corporate bonds, you can buy and hold treasury securities and know that your money is safe. Who do we want to use our savings: Wall Street investors or the many agencies of our government we depend on to make our life livable?”

CEF: We got a taste of the difference when the recession in 2009 wiped out 30 percent of the retirement savings for many of us but the Social Security checks came on time for the right amount.

SLL: The middle class standard of living is stagnant, not because the government borrows too much, but because it has reconfigured our tax structure to direct 3 of every 4 new dollars of wealth to passive investors and away from active investors (workers and government agencies) ...the reverse of what it was in the post WWII tax code.”

CEF: I don't doubt that is a factor but the primary reason is the unions have been crushed by moving and the threat of moving more manufacturing overseas. Only a small percentage of workers are represented by a union to fight for higher wages, medical care, and perks.

### Hysteria or Reality?

SLL: “The bottom line is this: hysteria over the national debt is a red herring; the tax code is where everyone but the 1 percent is skinned.”

CEF: We don't stand on the firm “financial” ground we once had. Wall Street demonstrated its greed and incompetence in 2008/2009 when it caused a recession with bogus lending practices.

Congress can no longer be counted on to protect the country or solve problems. Members of Congress would welcome a government shutdown out of ignorance. They are not aware of the potential catastrophe an extended shutdown could cause. That could be the crack that BRIC (Brazil, Russia, India, China) needs to convince the world the dollar should no longer be the world's base currency. China already refuses dollars for international trade and multiple countries now ignore the World Trade Organization when dealing in international trade.

### Summation:

We can't go on pretending we are the world leader and everything is fine. When you owe \$22 trillion you are walking on egg shells and the slightest perturbation can cause catastrophic results.

Dtrump and his ignorance is making things worse with his bluffs and tariffs. He pretends to be a tough guy and saves us from mothers and children crossing our southern border while the wars in Afghanistan, Iraq, and Syria drag on. He pretends to understand international trade by imposing tariffs, a tax paid by Americans, on imported goods.



*In Darlene's own words:*




I feel fortunate to have been her friend.

I know I am not the only one. She blessed so many with her friendship. She looked for the best in everyone. It’s what made her special. It’s what made her noble.


I’ll miss her, but I’ll also remember her example.
