It Ain't Over, Folks

The shutdown is over and Americans are back to work, for pay. Indentured servitude has ended for the time-being. In a *Texas Monthly* Article, the question is asked, “Why Aren’t Texas Politicians Standing Up for Texas Landowners?” (www.texasmonthly.com/politics/texas-politicians-asked-ted-cruz-standing-up-for-texas-landowners/) The article talks about the fight for Texas land, describing the land along the Red River as “thin strips of inaccessible river scrub land... Texas politicians may well have been right to come to the defense of the Red River ranchers.” The writers continued, “...a federal agency under the purview of Barack Obama coming to Texas to take land from ranchers... Militia members came and rallied on some of the disputed land, employing superheated rhetoric and the FBI followed them. ... The immense political pressure worked — after reducing its claim, the BLM [Bureau of Land Management] dropped the matter entirely when President Donald Trump took office, the lesson was that Texans could be brought to revolt even in defense of thin strips of inaccessible river scrub land.”

The dTrump plan for the Rio Grande River is to build the wall down the center of the river, clear-cut through private land, destroy and/or confiscate natural resources, valuable land areas like The National Butterfly Center, and cemeteries. The proposed wall would cut a wide swath of land and also install a myriad of offensive, environmental detrimental equipment This in the name of supposed border protection in, as Lt. Governor Patrick says, “additional wall building is a life-or-death matter for Texas.” The article concludes by asking the question, “Why has no one who supports the wall made the honest case that the wall would be worth more to the nation than it would cost south Texans?”

Eminent Domain is an elephant in the room. In Texas, by checking a simple check box, an entity is deemed a “common carrier” making the land available at market rates and in the public interest. During the 86th Legislative Session, Texas Democrats will:

NEWS FROM ROCKWALL COUNTY DEMOCRATS

The Texas secretary of state's office announced it would send local election officials list of 95,000 registered voters who the state says counties should be checking to see whether they are U.S. citizens and therefore, legally eligible to vote. Rockwall County Elections Office will be investigating people on the list by sending a request for proof of citizenship that must be responded to within 30 days.

An acceptable document to prove citizenship is a Certified Birth Certificates, U.S. Passport or Naturalization Certificate.

Texas Civil Rights Project, LULAC and the State Democratic Party will be following these actions closely. If you learn of a CITIZEN who is included on the state's list of alleged noncitizen voters, please have them contact Glen Maxey at the Texas Democratic State party office (512)-478-9800 or gmaxey@txdemocrats.org without delay so that we can work with them.

Redistricting

At the January 22 meeting of Rockwall County Commissioner's Court the Commissioners voted to hire Allison, Bass & Assoc., LLP. to provide professional services for the reapportionment/redistricting of Rockwall County after the 2020 Census. In the Public Forum, prior to the meeting LULAC President, Sol Villasanna requested a Citizen's Committee and Judith Matherne, Rockwall County Democratic Chair requested a workshop before decisions are made regarding voting precinct boundaries.

Election Team Workers

Rockwall Dems. held a training for Deputy Voter Registrars at the January, First Monday Training. Several DVR's have been certified by Dallas and Collin County Elections.

Helping others is a Democratic tenet. President Jimmy Carter and Mrs. Carter are active in Habitat for Humanity — helping to build homes for needy citizens. Their labor models a caring for others and guides all of we Democrats to do our part.

The Dallas County Democratic volunteers work with Meals on Wheels to get meals to Senior Citizens. Volunteers tell us of warm exchanges with folks.

There are 28,105 registered 501(c)(3) organizations in the 16 counties that make up the North Texas area. (Up from 19,336 organizations in 2009). Nationally, more than 1.5 million nonprofit organizations are registered with the IRS. This does not include groups that are not 501(c)(3).

Community service is not difficult. Select an organization whose purpose is aligned with the Democratic platform. The schedule of services of the organization must be flexible and/or provided at a time when your volunteers are available. Take credit on behalf of the organization. Be sure to wear a DCDP tee shirt and greet those you serve on behalf of the Dallas County Democratic Party.

To recruit volunteers, be authentic. Roll up your sleeves and work within the organization in which you wish to recruit. Let people see you working before you attempt to recruit anyone. Lead by example. Know your audience. Make sure you know where someone stands before you try to recruit. Recruitment should be part of a natural conversation. It is easiest to recruit by inviting people to a specific event.

Introduce them to fellow Democrats. Make sure they feel welcome; invite them again! Share your experiences. Let people see your enthusiasm for the Dallas County Democratic Party. Be sure to thank them.

How insignificant is it? If you saved \$50 thousand dollars per year, you would have to live 100,000 years [1,000 centuries] to save \$5 billion dollars.

Remember: the City of Garland is going to ask citizens to approve a \$1 billion dollar bond issue in 2019. To be more realistic in our calculation: to pay the bond off at the rate of \$1 million per year it will take 1000 years or 10 centuries, *ignoring* the interest.

January 25 at 4:12:p.m. Here is our response to the Secretary of State's announcement today and the Attorney General's alarmist tweets:

The announcement today by the Secretary of State is alarming, and, unfortunately echoes efforts around the country to remove eligible voters from the rolls. The Secretary's failure to fully disclose the methodology used to create his list is problematic.

Notably, Texas has one of the largest numbers of naturalizations in the United States, with about 50,000 Texas residents becoming naturalized citizens each year. Whether updates to the legal status of the persons on the Secretary's list has been taken into account is unclear and, based on the number of naturalizations in Texas every month, highly suspect.

Moreover, it is not clear whether the list includes duplicates that might result from comparing multiple data points against the Department of Public Safety's system. There is no credible data that indicates illegal voting is happening in any significant numbers, and the Secretary's statement does not change that fact.

It is also no surprise that the Attorney General tweeted about this announcement using alarmist language that is clearly intended to advance a false political narrative to further restrict access to the ballot box. Unfortunately, the state has opted to overzealously pursue election prosecutions and ruin the lives of Texans for minor mistakes while ignoring the substantial issue of our outdated and archaic election system that actually stops eligible voters from casting a ballot that counts.

The Secretary's actions threaten to result in tens of thousands of eligible voters being removed from the rolls, including those with the least resources to comply with the demand to show papers. And, make no mistake, the Attorney General's vitriolic statements are a warning to us all: the state is going to use this highly suspect "investigation" to try to pass laws that will make it harder for eligible Texas voters to cast a ballot that counts. We must all act to prevent such injustice.

No Place Like Home

Homelessness is the result of two powerful forces meeting: stagnant incomes for working families and the government's abandonment of home-ownership as the prime indicator of the middle-class economic status.

But it has not always been this way. The 30 year mortgage was an invention of the New Deal and the means by which the middle-class was grown in the post-WWII era.

So, what happened? According to a recent article, in *The New York Times*, regarding Microsoft's "\$500 million pledge to address affordable housing in the Seattle areas," the company has realized that homelessness is the failure of government to subsidize low-income housing, and they believe the private sector needs to fill that gap.

According to Diane Yentel, president of the National Low-Income Housing Coalition; "Today's modern phenomenon of homelessness didn't exist in the late 1970s because our country housed almost everyone including the lowest-income and most vulnerable families."

Who's to blame for the retreat? Politicians say that there is no money in the budget for such programs. Well, there was money before the 1980s! It was there because Congress enabled it to be there by adopting a progressive tax code! What does that look like?

According to my analysis of the marginal tax rate (the tax on new wealth created by the national economic engine), 73 percent, of new wealth went to "promote the general welfare" 1942 - 1963. From 1964 to 1981 it was 62.5 percent, resulting in an average rate of 67.7 percent for those first forty post-Depression years with minimal homelessness.

Then the effect of the new conservatism — the idea that the wealthy were being unfairly over-taxed — kicked in and the rate was slashed to 45.4 percent, then 36.8 percent, and then 28.4 percent, by the end of 1992. It was raised to 34 percent, in 1993-2002 and then slashed again to 28.8 percent, between 2003-2012, when it was slightly raised to 30.5 percent.

The bottom line is that between 1942 and 1981, 67.7 percent of every federal tax dollar went, in part, to subsidize housing for all Americans. Between 1982 and 2016 that number has been cut by more than a half to 34 percent. The ratio of 2:1 (worker: investor) flipped to 1:2 with the fewest, least needy and least essential to the economic engine benefitting the most.

So, where are we today? Every homeless family is a monument to Congress's abandonment of the poor and middle class in favor of giving the wealthy ever more money than they have a need.
